

SKI PATROL PROCEDURES FOR VISITING SCHOOLS

Welcome to Brimacombe's School Program. We hope your time spent with us is enjoyable.

We would like to outline some of our procedures in the event that one of your students is injured.

In the event that one of your students is injured, they will be assessed and treated by one or more of our Certified Ski Patrollers. Depending on the severity of the injury, the student may need to seek medical attention from a Hospital or Clinic.

If the injury is one that is not severe and transport can be arranged other than an ambulance, the Ski Patroller will arrange transport. A parent/guardian or teacher that drove a vehicle, other than the bus, will be the first choice for travel to the medical facility. This decreases the wait time for the student to be seen by health professionals at a medical facility, as the parent/guardian or teacher is present at the ski hill and the wait time is reduced for the student to be seen at a medical facility.

If there is no vehicle available for use at Brimacombe, pickup by a parent/guardian, or other appropriate family member, will be arranged by the Ski Patroller. All phone calls made to a parent are **first to be made by a Ski Patroller** and if the teacher/guardian wishes to speak to the parent they may do so after the Ski Patroller has given the parent the appropriate information regarding his/her child.

In the event that the student's injury is severe and requires immediate transport to a hospital, an ambulance will most likely be called. If an ambulance is called, the parent or guardian of the student will be contacted by the Ski Patroller **after the ambulance has arrived and has decided which hospital they will be going to**. The teacher/guardian may speak with the parent/guardian if they wish, **after** the Ski Patroller has **first spoken** to the parent/guardian. As well, a teacher or representative from the school (if available) may be asked to attend in the ambulance.
